## Headteacher Message

Dear Parents and Carers,  
Yesterday I received a letter from Knowsley local authority stating that "On 14 June 2021, the Government announced that the Liverpool City Region (which includes Knowsley) is eligible for what they describe as "enhanced support" due to increasing cases in our City Region of the Delta variant of COVID-19". The letter goes on to share advice on what measures we should reintroduce as precautionary measures. Unfortunately, this means we will have to return back to wearing face masks on school premises at all times. In addition, all trips, visits and PTA events will no longer be able to take place. As staff we are extremely disappointed that this is the case however, we must support and comply with all local measures. We do however, aim to provide our normal celebration day at the end of term, albeit in class bubbles in individual classrooms. More information on this will be sent home closer to the time. Please note, next Friday, 25th June is a staff training day and children should not attend school. Finally, I am delighted to announce that we will be hosting a two-week summer school (weeks commencing 26<sup>th</sup> July and 2<sup>nd</sup> August). There will be a maximum of 60 children on site each day. Initially, children have been selected by the class teachers using a strict criterion. More information will follow next week. ### LATE PICK UP FROM SCHOOL

If children are not collected at the normal pick up time of 2.40pm OR are late being collected from an afterschool activity, they will go into afterschool which is chargeable as follows:

½ hour from school close time= £3 per day

1 hour from school close time= £5 per day

anything after a 1 hour stay up until 5.30pm = £10 per day  
(Late after 5.30pm - £1 for every minute late)
