Dear Parents and Carers,

Recently our school council have been working with the Knowsley traffic department, the Police and children from St Anne's Catholic Primary School, looking at how we can reduce traffic outside our Schools, as well as educating parents about the dangers of inconsiderate parking. LATE PICK UP FROM SCHOOL
