LATE PICK UP FROM SCHOOL

If children are not collected at the normal pick up time of 2.50pm OR are late being collected from an afterschool activity, they will go into afterschool which is chargeable as follows:

 $\frac{1}{2}$ hour from school close time= £3 per day 1 hour from school close time= £5 per day anything after a 1 hour stay up until 5.30pm = £10 per day (Late after 5.30pm - £1 for every minute late)
