What Do I Do Outside School?

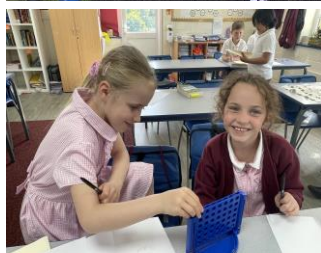
