Dear Parents and Carers,

As part of our ongoing staff professional development, we had a writing moderation training session after school on Monday. Staff from both schools come together with samples of their children's writing to discuss the standard and therefore the overall assessment of the children's work. The staff and I were extremely pleased with the standard across the piece. The progress the children have made so far from September has been exceptional.

On Tuesday I was treated to an exciting, cross school competitive match of Boccia between both schools. Year 3 and 4 children battled it out in a number of exciting end to end matches. It was

lovely to see the competitive edge to both teams but also the compassion and encouragement that was shown by all children. This cross-school competition is one of many reasons why both schools hold the Knowsley Gold standard for physical education.
