Prices changes

As I am sure you will all be aware there have been significant increases in both staffing and food costs. This will mean with effect from 1 September 2023 the cost of wraparound care will be as follows :

- Breakfast Club - £2.50 per day
- Nursery Wraparound - £17.50 per afternoon
- Afterschool Club – First ½ hour - £3
- First 1 hour - £5



Anything more than first hour is classed as full session until 5.30pm - £12.50

Knowsley Council have also increased the price of a school meal from September also due to price increases in staffing and food costs, therefore the price of a school meal from September will increase to £2.20 .

All wraparound care is to be booked through the MCAS parent app. Our numbers are capped, so please remember to book, as we may not have availability on the day. If you have booked an afterschool sessions and no longer require it, please email the school office ASAP. Thank you

If children are not collected at the normal pick up time of 2.50pm OR are late being collected from an afterschool activity, they will go into afterschool which is chargeable as follows:

- anything after 1 hour up until 5.30pm = £10 per day
- (Late after 5.30pm - £1 for every minute late)
